**Fight the New Drug is a non-religious and non-legislative organization** that exists to provide individuals the opportunity to make an informed decision regarding pornography by raising awareness on its harmful effects using only science, facts, and personal accounts.

What started as four college students questioning the normalization of pornography in society after seeing its impact in their lives and the lives of those around them, quickly sparked an educational grassroots campaign that grew into a world-wide movement to provide people with the opportunity to make an informed decision regarding pornography.

According to a nationally representative survey of U.S. teens, **84.4% of 14 to 18-year-old males and 57% of 14 to 18-year-old females have viewed pornography.** [1] And the majority of kids are exposed to porn by **age 13**. [2] Porn is a significant part of the culture young people are growing up in today, and despite how normalized pornography has become among young people, many remain unaware of the significant impacts of porn consumption for individuals, relationships, and society, as is demonstrated through decades of studies from respected institutions. [3]

Since 2011, Fight the New Drug's live, age-appropriate, energetic, research-based presentation has reached over a million people from around the world and given countless individuals the opportunity to consider before consuming pornography. They have over 6 million social media followers and continue to lead an international movement dedicated to spreading awareness on the impacts of pornography and fighting for love.

Fight the New Drug's presentation walks individuals and students through how pornography impacts individuals, relationships, and society and provides them with the resources and tools to make an informed decision regarding pornography.
